



'Holscher' Chairs

The Holscher Chair acquired its name because of the steel tube construction made by the blacksmith Svend Holscher, the father of professor Knud Holscher. Svend Holscher was a blacksmith in the small town of Rødby, his son Knud was a good friend of Poul Kjaerholm. The chairs were only manufactured for the Kjaerholm family and friends. The winding of the flag halyard was done by Hanne and Poul Kjaerholm, Knud Holscher and in this case, Holø Bergljot.
